Acts of the Apostles 4:32-35 1 John 5:1-6 John 20:19-31

"In the divine image He created them male and female; He created them." Genesis 1:27

IF I HAD ONLY KNOWN THE WHOLE STORY!

Dear Family,

Does the name Paul Potts ring a bell? If not, he was a mobile phone salesman in Wales, England up until about 15 years ago when he auditioned on Britain's Got Talent, the precursor to today's America's Got Talent, the Voice, and the like. Paul was a very shy, somewhat overweight man with a broken front tooth that was impossible to not notice when he wrestled out a partial smile. It was hard for Paul to smile because of his self-consciousness and the fact that he had been the target of cruelty from his peers much of his life.

Anyway, Paul's wife encouraged him to try out for Britain's Got Talent because she actually knew him and knew he had an amazing talent...he could sing opera...not just at an ok level; he could really sing. But, almost no one else knew. So, with his wife's encouragement, Paul signed up for the show.

At his audition, like with all the other contestants, he was questioned by the judges about who they were, what they did and what they were going to perform. The judges were Simon Cowell, the creator of Britain's/America's Got Talent. Simon is notorious for his insulting commentary about people's lack of talent. The other two were Amanda Holden an English actress/singer/model, and Piers Morgan who would one day be a talk show host in the United States. At that point the camera panned to Piers Morgan as he leaned back in his chair while turning toward Simon Cowell with a look that was, at the same time, a combination of seeming disgust and disbelief.

With that, they wished Paul luck and the music began. By the time Paul got to the second line of the song Nesum Dorma, everyone watching knew something about Paul Potts they couldn't know by just looking at him...THIS MAN COULD SING AT AN ELITE LEVEL. Paul Potts has gone on to become a worldwide star using the amazing vocal talent God gave him.

So why recount this story? Because it's so common. We so often jump to conclusions based on what we see and we won't admit to ourselves that we don't know the whole story about someone or something.

Piers Morgan and the others had already judged Paul Potts as someone who couldn't possibly have an exceptional singing voice. No, he just didn't "LOOK" like he could. After Paul concluded they admitted as much. After the long, standing ovation, Simon Cowell said, "So, you work at Car Phone Warehouse and you did that; I wasn't expecting that, Paul". Amanda Holden admitted the same thing and later, Piers Morgan would go on to say that his expectations were low, in part, because of Paul's "horrible looking suit". Their comments proved that they had judged Paul ONLY BY WHAT THEY COULD SEE.

Whether it's thinking someone couldn't possible sing well because they don't "look right" or whatever it is, every one of us MUST admit that when it comes to anyone else about anything else, we just don't know the whole, amazing story. God bless and Mary keep you.
