Christmas Memories

Dear Family,

Christmas for me has always been a season of some of the greatest family memories. I was – and still am – blessed with a wonderful family that said this is time for us with God in a special way. I would like to share some of them with you.

I remember one evening as we were watching Frosty the Snowman – I was about 4. I loved Frosty – felt a connection to him...I was 4, what do you want? ② Anyway, when he melted I just fell apart. I cried and cried until...he came back to life. All I remember is my mom and dad on either side of me consoling me and assuring me it would turn out ok. And it did.

I remember another Christmas during the time my dad was sick. My mom went "a little over the top" with gifts. ⁽²⁾ We literally needed my dad's pick up (8' box not 6 1/2) to get all the presents to my sister's house. When the kids started passing out the gifts, my dad was sitting in a chair and before long he disappeared behind the pile of his gifts. We literally couldn't see him. He had to unwrap his way out.

I remember again, when I was about 4 or 5, as we were heading to Midnight Mass. (This is forever etched in my memory.) We were a little late and I remember it was so cold. (It always seemed extra cold on Christmas eve when I was growing up - cold in a good way.) I remember walking from the car to the church. I remember one particular step I took - I watched my right boot as I took a step and could hear the crunch of the cold snow under my boot. To this day that sound has always reminded me of going to Midnight Mass. As we climbed the 15 or so steps up to the main entrance doors I could begin to hear the organ as Mrs. Guian was warming up. Then we opened the doors - great big wooden ones - and all at once, like a blanket being softly laid over me, as if right on cue, the choir sounded their first notes of the pre-Mass concert, the smell of the votive candles in the vestibule filled my nose with the smell of prayer and then I looked up...the altar was magnificent. Candles covered the high altar, the Christmas trees each wore cloaks of white light, the altar boys were busy setting up for Mass and the people were trying to get a seat before the church filled up...and I knew where I was...I was home for Christmas...I was with my family; my mom, dad, brother and sister; my parish, and my heavenly Father all welcoming into our lives our eldest Brother, Jesus. What a gift!

These are just a few precious memories I wanted to share with you as we prepare for His arrival into our parish family.

May our Lord provide you and your family with those most precious memories that only time with God and family can provide.

May God bless and Mary keep each and every one of you close to their hearts this Christmas and always.
