LENTEN GAME PLAN

Dear Family,

Lent is upon us this Wednesday. The Super Bowl is upon us today. As the Kansas City Chiefs and the San Francisco 49ers prepare for the world championship of football, each team is looking to the coaching staff to provide for them a winning game plan, based on the opponent's strengths and weaknesses. They expect nothing less! After all, what awaits the victor is the title WORLD CHAMPION!

Lent is our time of battle in which we wage war on the Enemy. This battle, even more than that of the Super Bowl, requires a game plan, for there is an eternal reward. After all, what awaits us as victor is the title of ETERNAL CHAMPION better known as SAINTI

So, from the National Catholic Register, here's a guide for your game plan. Each of us needs to tailor this plan to our own individual situation based on what we know about ourselves.

- Sacrifice Big Make personal sacrifices that really mean something to you!
 Only in stretching ourselves can we grow. There must be some discomfort or else there will be no progress. As the sayings go, No pain, no gain; no cross, no crown; no gall, no glory! It's just true!
- 2. Don't sacrifice too big The ancient philosopher, Socrates said, "'Tis great wisdom to know thyself". Know the boundaries between discomfort which strengthens and pain which weakens. Also, don't set yourself up for failure. Begin slowing but be certain to progress and intensify!
- Mortify yourself As the NCR article says, "Every single saint practiced some form of mortification. You and I need to as well! Though there may be no sin and not practicing some mortification, there is also no progress when we don't.
- 4. Fast Again, the article says, "Every single saint fasted" which makes us realize that we do not live by bread alone. We learn the difference between what we want and what we need. And God provides for all of our needs. In this we grow in trust of Him.
- 5. No feasting On Sundays during Lent it is permissible and, I would argue, even advisable, to exit from your Lenten discipline for that day. However, one should not become a glutton through overindulgence in the very things that one gave up. Also, I find it more difficult to renew the discipline after having taken that Lord's Day break, which adds to the benefit of the Lenten sacrifice.
- 6. Pray Have a clear prayer plan that is greater than your prayer regiment throughout the rest of the year. Lent isn't only about giving up things, it's about adding to the good that one does. In this case, it is adding more time in personal relationship with God. Without prayer, without God, we can do nothing!
- 7. Reach out Remember, the three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Challenge yourself to be more generous than you normally are. It may not be with money, but even more impactful on all involved would our increased generosity in time serving others. Refer to the Corporal and Spiritual works of Mercy for ideas.

Lent is our opportunity for life-long change and to more fully commit to living the life of a saint. After all, for every saint, named and unnamed, awaits the title, ETERNAL CHAMPION! God bless and Mary keep you!
