## EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

- Did I purposefully withhold a serious sin in any previous confession?
- Did I fail to do my penance?
- Have I neglected my duties at home, work, or school?

• Have I missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation without a serious reason? (Work, traveling, and sports do not normally constitute a serious reason. "Essential service" workers can be excused such as E.R. doctors/nurses; firefighters, police, etc.)

- Have I used God's name (Father, Son, or H.S.) irreverently or in vain?
  Do I spend Sunday in extra prayer and time with family or do I work, treating Sunday like any other day of the week?
- Have I failed to spend time with God in prayer, daily?
- Have I participated fully in Lent through prayer, fasting and almsgiving and other forms of preparation for the coming of Easter?

• Have I disobeyed, or been disrespectful to my superiors (parents, teachers, employer)?

- Have I quarreled with, or purposefully hurt, anyone?
- Have I been cruel (physically or mentally) to anyone?
- Have I made use of horoscopes, ouija boards, fortune tellers, séances, or anything considered New Age or occult?
- Have I had an abortion or assisted or referred someone to have an abortion?
- Have I caused or led anyone else to commit sin?
- Have I used pornographic material?
- Have I offended against purity in thought, word, or action?
  - With another outside the sacred bonds of marriage
  - With self
- Have I stolen or destroyed another's property?
- Have I accepted stolen goods?
- Have I failed to pay my just debts?
- Have I lied?
- Have I gossiped?
- Have I told another's faults, though they may be true, without a good reason to do so?
- Have I made up lies about another in order to hurt them?
- Have I failed to be thankful to God for the gifts He has given me?
- Have I drank alcohol (for adults, have I drank to excess) or taken illegal drugs?
- Have I failed to observe the Church's laws of fasting and abstinence?
- Have I failed to receive communion during Eastertime?
- Have I received Holy Communion in a state of unconfessed mortal sin?
- •Have I approached Mass unprepared and without due reverence?

- Have I sinned against the duties of married life?
- Have I failed to show the love, respect, and good example due my spouse?
- Have I neglected my duties to my children concerning their religious instruction, education, or cultivation of good habits?
