Dear Family,

We just celebrated the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Although this year's celebration was not a holy day of obligation because it landed on a Monday, it should not diminish the importance of what the great feast celebrates.

How often have you and I heard someone who is either not Catholic or no longer practices their Catholic faith question the Church's doctrine of calling Mary the mother of God? For me it is not uncommon. If you are ever posed with this question, here are some of the biblical foundations for this Truth of the faith.

We begin with the promise of a savior in Genesis 3 when God said to the serpent, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, between your seed and her seed." (Gen 3:15) What seed is hers? Jesus, of course, but also us. Therefore the enmity is the sinfulness you and I struggle against every day. Fast forward, now, to the birth of Jesus.

The angel Gabriel said to Mary, "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called son of the Most High." (Lk 1:31-32a) Shortly after that, Mary visited Elizabeth and upon her arrival there Elizabeth said, "Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb! And why is this granted me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" (Lk 1:42-43) Finally, the beginning of John's Gospel says, "In the beginning was the Word

Finally, the beginning of John's Gospel says, "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God...and the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." (Jn 1:1,14)

These are some key texts but they are by no means exhaustive. So, here is what the scripture passages mean followed by a way to sum up the doctrine.

Human nature is what was damaged by the sin of Adam and Eve and that damage has been passed down through the ages up to and including you and me. This is the enmity spoken of in Genesis 3:15. And, since man does not have the power to redeem his own sinful human nature, God had to. So, God became one of us while remaining God in order to accomplish this. This is what John 1:1 and John 1:14 is talking about. Finally, when God became a man he did so by taking his human nature from Mary, and this is what Elizabeth's exclamation means – Mary is the Mother of her Lord who is God.

Now we can sum this up this way. Jesus is God and became a man while remaining God. Mary is the mother of Jesus, therefore, Mary is the mother of God.

I hope this is at least somewhat clear and helpful. Whether it is or it is not, I hope and pray you have a very blessed New Year. God bless and Mary the Mother of God keep you.

INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE - The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting or use your camera's smartphone to scan the QR code to the right. (you can also paste this QR code into your bulletin for parishioner use) Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.
