A New Organ?

Dear Family,

As you may or may not know, our organ AND our keyboard, are both on the fritz. Both are in the 30 to 40-year-old range and have served us well but, like everything, years of service come and go. For both, those years have gone. So, we are looking for a new organ that will serve the parish family for the next 40-50 years; one that gives us, and those after, the best sound quality that we can afford and one that is practical, given that quality.

Why an organ and not just a piano? Good question. Well, as Catholics, we always look to see what our Holy Mother, the Church has to say about a given subject. In the case of the organ, she has this and much more to say, "In the Latin Church the pipe organ is to be held in high esteem, for it is the traditional musical instrument which adds a wonderful splendor to the Church's ceremonies and powerfully lifts up man's mind to God and to higher things." (Article 120) In fact, the organ is the only instrument the Church recognizes as suitable in the Roman rite of the liturgy without any question. Why? Here's what Pope Benedict XVI had to say in his Regensberg address in 2006. The organ has always been considered, and rightly so, the king of musical instruments, because it takes up all the sounds of creation – as was just said – and gives resonance to the fullness of human sentiments, from joy to sadness, from praise to lamentation. By transcending the merely human sphere, as all music of quality does, it evokes the divine. The organ's great range of timbre, from piano through to a thundering fortissimo, makes it an instrument superior to all others. It is capable of echoing and expressing all the experiences of human life. The manifold possibilities of the organ in some way remind us of the immensity and the magnificence of God. (Emphasis added)

One question that may be on your mind is whether we are looking at getting a pipe organ. The answer due to a number of considerations, one of which is ongoing maintenance costs as well as space is, almost certainly no. With the massive improvement to the quality of sound in the digital organs, though a pipe organ may be practical for a cathedral, basilica, or extremely large parish, for a smaller country parish such as St. Mary's, the limit of practicality soon gets compromised. So, we are looking at digital organs since they have exceptional sound quality and almost no ongoing maintenance cost. I humbly ask that you pray for guidance on what would be most pleasing to our Lord. More to come on this endeavor.
