# November 26, 2023 Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28 Matthew 25:31-46

#### **CONFESSION - Part 1**

Dear Family,

Following is the first of a two-part series on confession. The text comes from our Diocesan Office of Catechesis and Evangelization. This year we will be a deanery reconciliation service on Sunday, Dec. 17th<sup>th</sup> beginning at 3pm. If you have school aged children, please exemplify for them your desire for God's mercy and bring them with you to confession.

Each year during Advent and Lent we focus on God's mercy and the sacrament of penance as a means of preparing ourselves for Christmas and Easter. Please, however, do not relegate your confession visits to only these. St. John Paul II said that we should go to confession at least once per month. We need the grace received through frequent use of the sacraments in order to make any real spiritual progress. Without that progress, no heaven! It's that simple. A holy Advent means a happier Christmas celebration!

Pope Francis spoke these words a few years ago, "Be courageous and go to Confession!" Why is the Sacrament so important for our well-being? Jesus instituted the Sacrament of Confession because we need healing from the effects of personal sin after Baptism. The Lord is the doctor of the soul. Let's take a closer look.

Pope Francis further explains in the following remarks made on February 19, 2014. Dear Brothers and Sister, through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist man receives new life in Christ. However, we are still subject to temptation, to suffering, to death and, because of sin, we can even lose this new life. Jesus therefore willed that the Church continue His works of salvation for her members, in particular through the Sacrament of Reconciliation...a Sacrament of healing.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation flows directly from [the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus]. In fact, on the very evening of Easter the Lord appeared to the disciples, saying, "Peace be with you! Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven" (John 20:21-23). This passage reveals to us the most profound dynamic that is contained in this Sacrament.

First of all, the fact that the forgiveness of our sins is not something that we can give ourselves. I cannot say: "I forgive my sins." [When we sin, who is it that is sinned against? Is it me? When I sin, do I sin against myself? Modern relativism says that is the case. President Obama was asked once, "What is sin?" His answer is shocking and yet is almost to be expected from anyone of us who have been formed by relativism. He said that sin was defined as "Being out of line with my own values." Think about that for a second...King David says, "Against You, [Lord], You alone have I sinned, what is evil in our sight I have done." (Ps 51) If sin is contrary to what I have determined is right or wrong, then where does God fit in? What about the 10 Commandments? God wrote those laws, not me; not you. So, when we sin, we must ask God, Himself, for forgiveness. And, as that we read above, He chooses to be present through the priest.]

Forgiveness is asked from Jesus. Forgiveness is not the fruit of our efforts but it is a gift of the Holy Spirit, who fills us with the purification of mercy and grace which flows incessantly from the wide-open Heart of the crucified and risen Christ.

Next week we will conclude this two-part series. Please use the Examination of Conscience in preparation for confession. No mercy, no peace: Know mercy, know peace. God bless and Mary keep you.

Third week of November – The Corporal Works of Mercy - "...Jesus announced the judgment of the Last Day in his preaching. ....Our attitude about our neighbor will disclose acceptance or refusal of grace and divine love. On the last day Jesus will say: "Truly I say to you, as you did to the least of these my brethren, you did it to me."

- \* Jesus wants us to carry on His work on earth by caring for all the people whom God has made and love so much.
- \*The word 'corporal' comes from Latin and means body and Mercy is another word for kindness (not necessarily deserved) We could say Corporal Works of Mercy are acts of kindness toward the body of our neighbor.
